### **Call to Order, Roll Call, Establish Quorum**

Meeting called to order at 5:02 p.m. Roll call was taken, and a quorum was established.

### **Approval of Agenda (Motion/Discussion)**

Steve moved to approve the agenda, Sarah seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

### **Approval of Minutes (Motion/Discussion)**

Sue moved to approve the minutes from the June meeting, Sarah seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

### **Photo Contest Submissions**

Marcella provided information to the Commission on how selected photos would be used in the City's Budget Book as well as what past winners of the contest have been awarded. Marcella also clarified that photos become property of the City.

Commissioners commented on the high quality of submitted photos and discussed what might work well with the Budget Book given last year's selection. Commissioners settled on selecting four photos that represented the four seasons in Warrensburg to be displayed as a collage in the Budget Book. Those photos include:

- 1) Twanda Moore, "Kids on Log" (Spring)
- 2) Mindy Williams, "Lion's Lake Sunset" (Summer)
- 3) Michael Toller, "Pertle Springs, Fall Bench" (Fall)
- 4) Michael Toller, "Winter City Center, Night" (Winter)

### **Warrensburg Arts Trifold**

Sarah gave an overview of the trifold draft she has created promoting art in Warrensburg. She will create a map to indicate where selected arts and events are and include a QR code for each location, linking to existing web content. She is still waiting on a description of murals from Warrensburg Main Street. Eddie noted that for the Courthouse Concerts, the description should include the phrase, "Seating is first come, first served." Cindy asked about including the Community Chorus; Allison noted that organization might be combined with the Community Band blurb, or included in place of the murals if no information was received from WMS.

**Third Wednesday Art Walks**

Steve gave a brief report on the June art walk, noting that it was hot. For the July 20 art walk, Allison will set up the table.

## Yard Art Project

### Concept

A community-wide collection of individual art projects focused on a theme of kindness. Art to be displayed in yards or windows.

### Description of work

- Abstract, assembled, mixed media, representational and written word variations of the theme accepted.
- Medium used is up to individual artist.
- Paint and other products to be provided by participants or sponsoring organizations.
- Restrictions prohibit the use of sexual images and/or offensive language.

### Surface

*Please note my initial thought was to repurpose 18"X24" corrugated plastic signs as the surface for art work. Additional research revealed this option to be unrealistic from a logistical and cost perspective (details available on request).*

Blank corrugated plastic signs (with stakes) are available in sizes listed below. Cost per sign range from \$1.62 to \$1.92 each.

### Benefit to community/desired effects

- I believe this project can and will be a vehicle for civic engagement as it creates social value throughout our community.

- I imagine a casual event that provides the opportunity for toddlers to create colorful art with minimal mess (details available upon request).
- The concept offers an opportunity for everyone from those in pre-school to those in senior living facilities.

-In keeping with a goal of inclusion I've spoken with Johnson County Board of Services, Rise and Wils who have all expressed interest in participating.

### Potential Community Partners

Rise, Wils, JCBS, BBBS, public and private schools, UCM student organizations, businesses, churches, Senior Center, Parks & Rec, Veterans home, Care centers, Main Street, Chamber of Commerce, service clubs (Rotary, Lions, Warrensburg Young Professionals, etc) and more.
